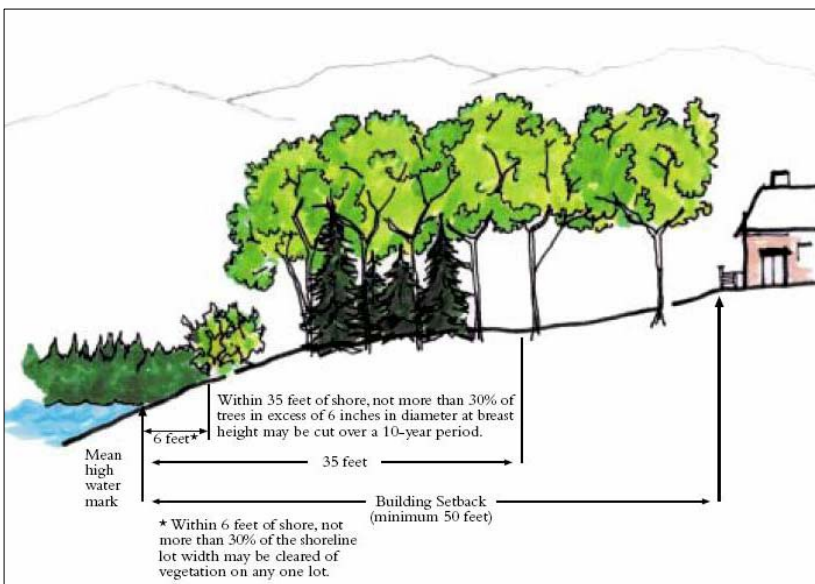

**Overlapping Jurisdiction in the
Adirondack Park:**

The need for a permit depends on the land use area in which the property is located - proximity to water bodies, streams and wetlands.

The following activities in the APA may require an APA permit, and ALSO require contact with the Caroga Code Officer: Selling or gifting a portion of your land, filling or excavating or otherwise impacting a wetland, altering the natural flow, level or condition of a stream, lake or pond, constructing a retaining wall, deck, or other structure within 100 feet of a shoreline, cutting vegetation within 35 feet of a shoreline, or clear cutting more than 3 acres.





Notes from the Highway Superintendent

The Town Board of the Town of Caroga authorized the Highway Superintendent - Joseph Insogna to post weight limits on all dirt roads in the Town of Caroga as he sees fit and to put legal notice in the paper to the effect that the roads in town will be posted as necessary by him, therefore please note: **Putnam Road** is a Seasonal use Road and will be posted as such from December to April.

New Snowmobile Legislation **Effective 2/27/2006** No person under the age of 14 shall operate a snowmobile except upon land owned or leased by his or her parent or guardian. (Leased lands shall not include lands leased by an organization of which said owner or parent is a member) A person 10 or older but less than 14 who holds a valid snowmobile safety certificate may operate on any lands snowmobiling is allowed if accompanied by a person over 18. A person 14 or older but less than 18 who either holds a safety certificate or is accompanied by a person over 18 may operate a snowmobile in the same manor as a person over eighteen years of age. New York State Law Prohibits
snow plows from depositing snow on *or* across any State, County, or Local Highway.

Anyone anticipating putting in a **BLACKTOP** driveway is asked to please contact the Highway Superintendent before doing the job. The highway crew has run into a problem the blacktop extending into the Town roads, this is creating a problem for the towns equipment.

If you displace blacktop put down by the town you are responsible for repairing it !

Transfer Station permits must be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office.

Proof of residency and vehicle registration are required when purchasing permits.

Permits are valid from April 1st to March 31st

Cars - \$5.00 Pickup Trucks - 20.00 Trailers* - \$20.00 (single axel, max. size 5 x 8)

Temporary Truck or Trailer -\$5.00 Good for three trips

(A Separate Sticker must be purchased for the Tow Vehicle if it will be used separately during the year)

The County Restricts the amount of home improvement/remodeling & clean out project materials brought to the Caroga transfer station, the **equivalent of three (3) pickup truck loads.**
Loads must be covered or arranged so that no loose substances can fall from or blow out of them.

Curbside Garbage Pickup ~ ONE DAY A WEEK PICKUP YEAR ROUND

The Town is divided into two parts with the separation point being the Bridge at Sherman's (Mead Creek).

South End of Town - Garbage pickup is on Monday

North End of Town - Garbage pickup is on Tuesday

GARBAGE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR MUNICIPAL PICKUP

To be placed in front of each private dwelling (within six feet of all Town roads) throughout the town.

Garbage to be put at curbside is to be strictly garbage and not to include any RECYCLING, Diapers, Kitty Litter, Yard Debris, Etc. Garbage to be Curbside by 6 am on Day of collection. All Garbage must be placed in CLEAR plastic bags. **To keep animals from getting into bagged garbage - residents are encouraged to place garbage in a trash can with handle locks - up to 20 gallons in size.** PAINT CANS can now be placed curbside if they are empty, dry, and the lids are removed. The paint cans must be in their own separate plastic bag.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING IS THE FIRST & THIRD FRIDAY OF EACH MONTH

The Town of Caroga has purchased a RECYCLING DUMPSTER located at the Transfer Station for the convenience of residents.

You must have a Transfer Station Permit to use the Recycling Dumpster.

Personal Watercraft

As of 1/1/06 the minimum age to operate a PWC becomes 14 so long as the operator holds a safety certificate. Underage riders who have earned a boating safety certification can continue to operate if accompanied by someone 18 or older who is the holder of a boating safety cert. and is on either a PWC or motorboat within 500 ft & within sight of the underage operator.

The age of operation for motorboats is unchanged.

SANITATION

As of June 2003 drawings from an Architect are needed for new installations, repairs, alterations to septic systems and holding tanks. **Sanitation permit Cost: \$25**

HOLDING TANK REGULATIONS

Local Law #3-2006 requires owners of holding tanks to have them emptied by **June 1st** of each year and/or when it becomes 75% full or except on appeal to the Sanitation Officer. Pumping must be done by a pumper who has registered with the Caroga Town clerk.

JUNK & JUNK VEHICLES

No individual Junk (unregistered) automobiles may be so located as to be visible from Public Roads, Trails, Boat, or Canoe water ways. Junk & Debris Local Law #2-2005 & Subchapter 7 part 1242.10 Of the N.Y.S. Fire Prevention & Building Code.

MOBILE HOMES

Contact the Code Enforcement Officer for application and information regarding placement of a Mobile Home within the Town of Caroga. Removal of any existing Mobile Home, changes of ownership, or rental of a mobile home must be recorded with the Town Clerk. **A permit & Site Plan Review is needed for any and all additions, or alteration to an existing Mobile Home.**

Overnight Camping on Property in Caroga **BY PERMIT ONLY** available from the Town Clerk's office.
(3 permits per year 72 hours each)

Hawkers and Peddlers permit required: **\$50 for the year \$10 for five days**

* It is necessary to have a Professional Inspection made after a chimney fire *

Basic building permit: \$20

Includes; demolition, fences, walls (retaining), unit structural replacement (pier, stud, joist, rafter, etc.), solid fuel burning devices and chimneys, and other non-square footage issues. **Additions and other square footage issues: \$.20** per square foot.

Re-roof: \$25 (no change)

Sheds: \$20 (up to 144 sq. ft.)

Over 144 sq. ft. **\$.20** per square foot

New Structures: \$150 for the 1000 sq. ft. or fraction thereof, **\$75** thereafter for each 1000 sq. ft. or fraction thereof.

Total Renovation: \$50 Includes; windows, doors, interior walls, plumbing, etc.

Renewal of any permit: Cost to be the same as original permit.

Demolition: \$20 (permits to be good for 6 months)

Signs: \$20

A Little Caroga History Chronicle

1794 - The year of Glen, Bleecker and Lansing Patent, comprising 89,000 acres of land , including most of Bleecker and the future Town of Caroga. Settlers came shortly after, and a small community of farmers developed.

1824 - First school in North Bush, called the Shaw school was built.

1838 - The Newkirk Mills school was built. Newkirk Mills settled by Garret A. Newkirk, in the mid 1830's became the largest community in Caroga within a decade.

1842 - Town of Caroga created from tracts of land, from Stratford, Bleecker, and Johnstown.

1849 - Plank road from Fonda to Caroga completed.

1853 - Nicholas Stoner died and was buried at Kingsboro cemetery. Soldier in the Revolutionary War, expert trapper, hunter and woodsman, memorialized by Jephtha Simms in "trappers of New York" and later by Cyrus Durey, he became Caroga's legendary folk hero.

1856 - Land was purchased for \$10 and construction of the Wheelerville School began. This school was in continuous use until 1991, when the new school located by the E. Caroga outlet opened that fall.

1857 - John Francisco bought 2000 acres of Newkirk mills property including a tannery, sawmill, hotel and store.

1865 - The Wheeler-Claflin Company of Mass. Bought 20,000 acres of land 2/3 of the town, build a new large tannery by the Canada Lake inlet, saw mills, a multitude of homes for the tannery workers, a company store and barn to house the oxen and horses which were used to transport the hemlock logs to the tannery site. The barn still stands and became the Nick Stoner Inn.

1866 - Canada Lake House - First hotel of Canada Lake was built by Mr. Claflin, who had visions of making a summer resort around this beautiful lake. It burned in 1884.

1888 - James Y. Fulton built the second Canada Lake House a lovely hotel that offered boats for hire or excursions on the steamer Kanaughta, captained by Francis Fulton, son of the proprietor. This hotel burned to the ground in 1914.

1893 - The next hotel casualty was the elegant Asukerada Hotel. This popular hotel changed hands and named to Allen Inn in 1919 and burned down in 1921.

1899 - North Bush Methodist Church was incorporated. Except for a few years, it has been in continuous service to the community since its inception.

1917 - East Caroga Lake Protective Association was formed.

1921 - Frank Sherman build a pavilion complete with dance hall, big name brands, and bought a merry-go-round with lovely wooden horses.

1922 - Canada Lake Protective Association was formed. Lapsed and reactivated in 1952.

1925 - Electric power came to Caroga, not until 1935 to Pine Lake.

1951 - The Town of Caroga Fire Dept. was incorporated on March 20th . Charles Putman, then Town Supervisor, made the acquisition of the Fire Dept. his political platform.

1955 - The original Unger House burned.

1972 - Don and Pat Best purchased Vrooman's Hotel.

1977 - The Caroga Historical Assoc. was formed with Lena Durey as its charter president

1979 - The Nick Stoner Senior Citizens Club was organized at a meeting at the fire house in October.

1988 - West Caroga Lake Assoc. was formed in the summer with Kevin Grygiel as its first chairman.

1989 - Ruth and George Abdella purchased Sherman's.

1997 - Pine Lake Civic Assoc. was formed with Lucille Hunt as president.

The Assessor is available Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 9-3 pm.
Evening and weekend appointments are available by appointment.
Please call the Assessor's office on Monday or Thursday to ensure the clerk is available.

The Assessment Department can provide property owners with information on their property, tax maps, exemption information and general inquiries.

These are important dates to remember.

March 1, 2009 is taxable status day and the last day to apply for exemptions for 2009- 2010. The most common exemptions available for owner occupied residences include STAR (School Tax Relief) and Veterans exemptions. Property owners who are 65 years of age or older may qualify for additional exemptions based on their income status. Contact the assessor's office for more information on exemptions.

May 1, 2009 is the date for filing the 2009 Tentative Assessment Roll, which will be available for public inspection. If the Assessor has changed your assessment, you will receive a Change of Assessment Notice around this date.

May 28, 2009 is Grievance Day and the last day to file a complaint on your 2009 assessment. Property owners who wish to file a complaint on real property assessment must complete form RP 524 and provide documentation in support of their complaint on or before Grievance Day. Complaint forms are available at the Assessor's Office, Fulton County Real Property Office or on line at www.orps.state.ny.us.

July 1, 2009 is the date for filing of the 2009 Final Assessment Roll. This assessment information will include all changes the Board of Assessment Review has granted to property owners who successfully challenged their assessment at Grievance Day. The Final Roll will later become a Tax Roll to be used by your county, town and school district to levy the taxes for the next fiscal year.
